**Kathryn Hunter,
Taken Ill During Sunday Matinee Solo Performance of *Kafka's Monkey*,
Is Well and Will Return to the Baryshnikov Arts Center Stage Tuesday**

NEW YORK, April 15 - Kathryn Hunter, acclaimed for her performance as an ape in the current one-woman play *Kafka's Monkey*, fainted during the Sunday (April 14) matinee.

Ms. Hunter was not hurt, was examined by a doctor and deemed to be fine. She will return to the Baryshnikov Arts Center's Jerome Robbins Theater stage for her final three performances of *Kafka's Monkey* Tuesday at 8:00pm and Wednesday at 2:00pm and 8:00pm.

Kafka's Monkey is the Young Vic production presented by Theatre for a New Audience, in association with Baryshnikov Arts Center, for 18 performances through April 17. *Kafka's Monkey* is based on *A Report to an Academy* by Franz Kafka adapted by Colin Teevan and directed by Walter Meierjohann.

Ms. Hunter will begin previews Sunday, April 21, at 3:00pm in *Fragments*, a production of C.I.C.T. / Théâtre des Bouffes du Nord presented by Theatre for a New Audience in association with Baryshnikov Arts Center. Ms. Hunter stars along with Jos Houben and Marcello Magni in *Fragments*, which is directed by Peter Brook and Marie-Hélène Estienne. *Fragments* runs for 18 performances through May 5.
